Join us to listen to Holocaust Survivor, Suly Chenkin, tell her fascinating story. Suly speaks regularly at the Levine JCC Butterfly Project, a Holocaust Education and Remembrance Program.

Suly was 10 months old when her parents were forced to move to the Kovno Ghetto in Lithuania. She lived in the ghetto for three years before being smuggled out. Her parents were taken to concentration camps when the ghetto was liquidated in 1944. After a long journey, Suly and her foster family found safety in Palestine. She was eventually reunited with her parents, finding refuge in Cuba.
